## **Fayette County Burn Permit Process Change**

Effective October 1, 2014, the Fayette County Department of Fire and Emergency Services will change the method by which residents of unincorporated Fayette County, Tyrone, Brooks, and Woolsey will acquire outdoor burn permits. Historically, residents in those areas would call the automated burn permit line to secure a burn permit. As of October 1, that method of acquiring burn permits will no longer be available. The department has developed an online permit process that will quickly allow residents the ability to secure and print a permit that will be valid for the day in which the resident wishes to burn. This permit process does not include those living in the city limits of Fayetteville, and Peachtree City.

To acquire an online burn permit simply login on to the Fayette County Government website at <u>www.fayettecountyga.gov</u> click the link for "Residential Burn Permit" on the homepage. Once you are on the burn permit page read the information on the page, once you have read the information check the acknowledgement box, and then at the bottom click continue here to complete the application process. By clicking that box it will take you to the next page, there you will complete the required information to obtain the permit. After completing the information click the affirm information box and then click submit application. You have now completed the burn permit process and you may now print your burn permit. The permit is only good for the day in which you are burning. The pages below are what you will see when applying for a burn permit.

Those wishing to conduct a commercial burn or land clearing and wish to burn debris should contact the Fayette County Fire Marshal's Office at 770-305-5414.

### Online Burn Permit Process.

#### Outdoor Burning Permitted October 1 through April 30 each year

#### Outdoor Burning is NOT Permitted May 1 through September 30 each year.

#### THIS PERMIT IS NOT VALID FOR RESIDENTS WANTING TO BURN INSIDE THE CITY LIMITS OF FAYETTEVILLE AND PEACHTREE CITY.

#### The online burn permit process will only take a few minutes and must be completed before a permit can be issued.

- Effective May 1st thru September 30th there is an outdoor burning ban
- · Permits will be issued for the reduction of leaves, clippings, brush and limbs on residential properties by the person in contact with the premisesFor disposal of tree limbs from storm damage
- For weed abatement, disease and pest prevention
- No more than one pile burning at a time

## VIOLATIONS SUBJECT TO CITATION

#### The following rules must be followed

- All burning shall take place starting at 8:00am All fires must be completely extinguished by sunset
- All burning shall be conducted at least 50 feet from any structure
- All burning shall be constantly attended until extinguished
- · Fire extinguishing equipment such as a garden hose, shovel, rake or other device shall be readily available
- The Department of Fire and Emergency Services retains the authority to extinguish any fires in the event that a complaint (s) are received
