TITLE: Part-Time Accounting Technician

DEPARTMENT: Finance, Fayette County

JOB SUMMARY: This position is responsible for performing all accounting transactions, reconciliations, and financial reports of the County's new fund for the Griffin Judicial Circuit.

MAJOR DUTIES:

- Processes payables for Circuit, coding all invoices to proper expenditure as stated in The State of Georgia Chart of Accounts.
- Maintain travel requests for Circuit in a timely manner by working with Circuit staff, gathering all required travel documentation, making reservations, and preparing reimbursement requests.
- Records Revenue related to the Griffin Judicial Court.
- Maintains and reconciles Receivables for the Fund. Position books receivable and bills Counties for their portion of Griffin Judicial Circuit expenditures.
- Prepares Monthly Fund reconciliation and financial report for County CFO.
- Assists in the annual budget process and CAFR for Fund.
- Performs other related duties as assigned.
- KNOWLEDGE REQUIRED BY THE POSITION:
- Knowledge of governmental accounting practices and preparation of financial statements.
- Knowledge of governmental budget development and management procedures.
- Knowledge of computers and job related software programs.
- Skill to analyze issues and problems related to computer programs.
- Skill in public and interpersonal relations.
- Skill in researching and analyzing issues, providing recommendations, preparing financial reports.
- Skill in oral and written communication.

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SUPERVISORY CONTROLS: The Assistant CFO or Accounting Supervisor assigns work in terms of general instructions. The Assistant Chief Financial Officer or Accounting Supervisor spot-checks completed work for compliance with procedures, accuracy, and the nature and propriety of the final results.

GUIDELINES: Guidelines include county personnel policies, the County Ordinances, Generally Accepted Accounting Principles, Accounting and Auditing Standards, Government Finance Officers Association recommendations, and Federal and State Laws and Regulations. These guidelines require some interpretation in application.

COMPLEXITY: The work consists of related accounting duties. Strict regulations and the need for **accuracy** contribute to the complexity of the position.

SCOPE AND EFFECT: The purpose of this position is to maintain and report the Griffin Circuits expenditures and revenues. Success in this position contributes to the efficiency of department operations and presentation of County Financial statements.

PERSONAL CONTACTS: Contacts are typically with Griffin Circuit employees, co-workers, outside auditors, vendors, and members of the general public.

PURPOSE OF CONTACTS: Contacts are typically to give or exchange information, resolve issues, and provide services.

PHYSICAL DEMANDS: The work is typically performed while sitting at a desk or table. The employee occasionally lifts light objects.

WORK ENVIRONMENT: The work is typically performed in an office.

SUPERVISORY AND MANAGEMENT RESPONSIBILITY: None.

SPECIAL CERTIFICATIONS AND LICENSES: Possession of a valid State of Georgia driver's license (Class C) and a satisfactory Motor Vehicle Record (MVR) in compliance with County Safety and Loss Control Guidelines. Completion of the State of Georgia Department of Transportation Defensive Driving Course and/or Emergency Vehicle Operation Certification within twelve (12) months of employment.

ADA COMPLIANCE: Fayette County is an Equal Opportunity Employer. ADA requires the County to provide reasonable accommodations to qualified individuals with disabilities. Prospective and current employees are invited to discuss accommodations.

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HIPAA COMPLIANCE: The Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996, as amended, requires employees to protect the security of Protected Health Information (PHI) however it is obtained, handled, learned, heard or viewed in the course of their work.

DRUG AND ALCOHOL COMPLIANCE: In accordance of Fayette County's Substance Abuse Policy of 1996, as amended, all job applicants offered employment will undergo testing for the presence of illegal drugs and alcohol as a condition of employment. - o Sufficient experience to understand the basic principles relevant to the major duties of the position, usually associated with the completion of an apprenticeship/internship or having had a similar position for two or more years.
