TITLE: Water Meter Reading Supervisor

DEPARTMENT: Water System-Meter Reading, Fayette County

JOB SUMMARY: This position is responsible for supervising and participating in meter reading operations.

MAJOR DUTIES:

- o Manages and schedules meter reading for all water meters.
- o Prepares activity reports.
- o Trains, directs, assigns, supervises, evaluates, and disciplines personnel.
- o Resolves problems with malfunctioning meters and computer equipment failures.
- o Plans and schedules maintenance on large water meters.
- o Meets with sales representatives.
- o Oversees the maintenance of radio read transponders.
- o Oversees fire hydrant flushing.
- o Performs other related duties as assigned.

KNOWLEDGE REQUIRED BY THE POSITION:

- o Knowledge of Water System operations, policies, and procedures.
- o Knowledge of county policies and procedures.
- o Knowledge of modern office practices and procedures.
- o Knowledge of computers and job related software programs.
- o Knowledge of water meter location.
- o Knowledge of the installation, repair, and maintenance of water meters.
- o Skill in the training and supervision of personnel.
- o Skill in oral and written communication.
- o Skill in planning and meeting deadlines.

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SUPERVISORY CONTROLS: The Administrative Manager assigns work in terms of general instructions. The supervisor spot-checks completed work for compliance with procedures, accuracy, and the nature and propriety of the final results.

GUIDELINES: Guidelines include county and department standard operating procedures. These guidelines are generally clear and specific, but may require some interpretation in application.

COMPLEXITY: The work consists of related administrative and supervisory duties. Scheduling conflicts contribute to the complexity of the position.

SCOPE AND EFFECT: The purpose of this position is to supervise and participate in meter reading operations. Success in this position contributes to the efficiency of Water System operations.

PERSONAL CONTACTS: Contacts are typically with co-workers, vendors, customers, and members of the general public.

PURPOSE OF CONTACTS: Contacts are typically to give or exchange information; resolve problems; provide services; and motivate and influence persons.

PHYSICAL DEMANDS: The work is typically performed while sitting at a desk or table or while intermittently sitting, standing, or stooping.

WORK ENVIRONMENT: The work is typically performed in an office and outdoors, occasionally in cold or inclement weather.

SUPERVISORY AND MANAGEMENT RESPONSIBILITY: This position has direct supervision over Senior Water Meter Reader (1) and Water Meter Reader (4).

SPECIAL CERTIFICATIONS AND LICENSES: Possession of a valid State of Georgia driver's license (Class C) and a satisfactory Motor Vehicle Record (MVR) in compliance with County Safety and Loss Control Guidelines. Completion of the State of Georgia Department of Transportation Defensive Driving Course and/or Emergency Vehicle Operation Certification within twelve (12) months of employment.

ADA COMPLIANCE: Fayette County is an Equal Opportunity Employer. ADA requires the County to provide reasonable accommodations to qualified individuals with disabilities. Prospective and current employees are invited to discuss accommodations.

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HIPAA COMPLIANCE: The Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996, as amended, requires employees to protect the security of Protected Health Information (PHI) however it is obtained, handled, learned, heard or viewed in the course of their work.

DRUG AND ALCOHOL COMPLIANCE: In accordance of Fayette County's Substance Abuse Policy of 1996, as amended, all job applicants offered employment will undergo testing for the presence of illegal drugs and alcohol as a condition of employment. In the course of employment, employees are subject to random, reasonable suspicion, post accident and routine fitness for duty testing for illegal drugs and alcohol abuse. Employees are prohibited to work under the influence, to possess, to distribute or to sell illegal drugs in the work place or abuse alcohol on the job. Confirmed positive is reason for denial of employment and/or termination.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

- o Knowledge and level of competency commonly associated with completion of specialized training in the field of work, in addition to basic skills typically associated with a high school education.
- o Experience sufficient to thoroughly understand the work of subordinate positions to be able to answer questions and resolve problems, usually associated with one to three years experience or service.
- o Possession of or ability to readily obtain a valid driver's licenses issued by the State of Georgia for the type of vehicle or equipment operated.
