Minutes from the March 14, 2006 Recreation Commission meetings were approved unanimously.

Old Business:

- 2007 budget review by the county staff is underway with a draft to be ready in May 2006
- Follow up discussion regarding the March 14, 2006 Recreation Meeting
 - YMCA – leveraged Fayette County master plan to develop vision and they are not competing for other county recreation funds
 - John Feldt volunteers to draft a letter to the leadership of the YMCA to determine how the Fayette County Recreation Commission can assist the YMCA

New Business: Presentations

- Eagle Scout project – Alex Smith, Troop 63
 - Alex would like to install an 18 hole disc golf course on county park property at a cost of approximately \$600 per hole
 - The Recreation Commission moved to accept the project plan as submitted supports the development of the disc course

Fayette County Recreation Commission Officer Elections

- In the 2007 term, Bully Gunnin will continue to serve as Chairman, Frank Oakley will continue to serve as Vice Chairman, and Ed Quattlebaum will continue to serve as Secretary

2007 CIP Review

- Kiwanis Recreation Center rest room upgrade
- New floor in the Recreation Center
- Lighting upgrades in several parks
- Kelly Park project manager is hired
 - The old building is to come down
- Construction documents are being prepared.

Miscellaneous

- The recreation center was rented for a birthday party that got out of hand and police were called. The commission will review guidelines to determine what kind of supervision is required at gatherings that use county property
- A large baseball tournament was held in the county and resulted in a significant clean up effort by county staff. The commission will review guidelines to determine if there is a way to ensure that the tournament sponsors are responsible for all clean up efforts
- It has been brought to the attention of the Recreation Commission that background checks required by the county recreation associations are not as thorough and stringent as they should be
- The next Recreation Committee meeting will be held on May 9, 2006 at 7:00 P.M.

- The commission adjourns to executive session to discuss land
