June 6	Harry Potter and the Music of John Williams We will make wands and broomsticks as we listen to the John Williams music composed for the movie versions of these popular and now classic tales.
June 13	A Spoonful of Sugar: The Sherman Brothers and Mary Poppins We will make kites and bird feeders as we listen to the Sherman Brothers music written for the original Mary Poppins movie.
June 20	Can You Hear Me Roar? Hans Zimmer and the Lion King We will listen to the music composed for the movie while making Lion King megaphones.
June 27	The Music of Moana We will create jeweled crabs and necklaces as we listen to composer Mark Mancina's music from the film.
July 11	Origami Star Wars We will hear the music composed by John Williams for Star Wars while making origami and doing some Star Wars doodling.
July 18	The Music of Oz! We will use popsicle sticks and other materials to design some characters from the film while we listen to the music composed by Harold Arlen.
July 25	Wild Robots! We will hear the music for the movie Wall-E, explore stories and books about robots and use recyclables to make robots of our own.
