Age-Specific Programs

(Registration is not required for our programs) Baby Time: Wednesdays at 10 a.m.

Baby-friendly play time followed by songs, rhymes, puppets, stories and interactive fun for children ages 0-2.

Time for Twos: Tuesdays at 10 and 11 a.m. Songs, rhymes, puppets, stories and interactive fun for children ages 2-3 followed by a time for play and socialization with art, games and other toddler-friendly play.

Treasure Time: Wednesdays 11 a.m

Children ages **3-1**st **grade** explore the treasures we find in books mixed with songs, poetry, puppets, science and social learning. Our program is followed by a time for play and socialization with art, games, literacy and learning kits, STEM explorations, and more.

*Curiosity Club: Second Thursday at 4 p.m. Children ages 7-10 years will explore longer fiction and nonfiction picture books followed by discussion and hands-on activities.

*B3: Books, Bagels and Building: One Saturday per month 10 a.m. – noon. Youth ages 10-13 are invited to a book discussion followed by free time to explore creative and building materials. Books are available for checkout the month prior to the program.




Guidelines for Age-Specific Programs
The goal for our age-specific programs is to provide a developmentally-appropriate space for children. We understand that this can be challenging with children of multiple ages in the family so we have intentionally created multi-age programs and as flexible as possible guidelines to help meet your family's needs and our program goals.

- Younger and older siblings can attend most of our programs as long as they are not disruptive.
- Most of our programs require an adult to attend with the child. Programs with an asterisk * are geared for children to attend independently. Younger siblings cannot attend these programs. Parents should remain in the library during the program.
