GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS
ITB 26101-B Grass Cutting Services - Justice Center & McCurry Park

1. **Definitions:**

- a. **Bidder:** A company or individual who submits a bid in response to this Invitation to Bid.
- b. **Successful Bidder:** The company or individual that is awarded a contract.
- c. **Contractor:** The Successful Bidder, upon execution of the contract.
- d. **County:** Fayette County, Georgia.

2. **Bid is Offer to Contract:** Each bid constitutes an offer to become legally bound to a contract with the County, incorporating the invitation to bid and the bidder's bid. The binding offer includes compliance with all terms, conditions, special conditions, specifications, and requirements stated in the invitation to bid, except to the extent that a bidder takes written exception to such provisions, and the County agrees to the exception. All such terms, conditions, special conditions, specifications, and requirements will form the basis of the contract. The bidder should take care to answer all questions and provide all requested information, and to note any exceptions in the bid submission. Failure to observe any of the instructions or conditions in this invitation to bid may result in rejection of the bid.

3. **Binding Offer:** To allow sufficient time for a contract to be awarded, each bid shall constitute a firm offer that is binding for ninety (90) days from the date of the bid opening to the date of award.

4. **Bidder's Questions:** As appropriate, the County will post answers to questions and/or other information concerning the Invitation to Bid in the form of an addendum on the County's website at www.fayettecountyga.gov. It is the responsibility of the prospective bidder to check the website for any addenda issued for this invitation to bid.

5. **References:** Include with your bid a list of three (3) jobs that your company has done that are of the same or similar nature to the work described in this invitation to bid, on the form provided. Include all information as requested on the form.

6. **Bid Submission:** Submit your bid, along with any addenda issued by the County, in a *sealed* opaque envelope. Mail or deliver one (1) original bid, signed in ink by a company official authorized to make a legal and binding offer, and one (1) copy on a flash drive, to:

Also show your company name on the envelope. You may submit sealed bids in person, by U.S. mail, or by a commercial carrier. Do not submit bids by facsimile, e-mail, or other electronic means. Once submitted, all bids become the property of Fayette County.

7. **Bid Preparation Costs:** The bidder shall bear all costs associated with preparing the bid.

8. **Late Bids:** Bids not received in the Purchasing Department by the time and date of the scheduled bid

opening will not be considered.

9. **More than One Bid:** Do not submit alternate bids or options, unless requested or authorized by the County in the Invitation to Bid. If a responder submits more than one bid without being requested or authorized to do so, the County may disqualify the bids from that responder, at the County's option.
10. **Bid Corrections or Withdrawals:** The bidder may correct a mistake, or withdraw a bid, before the bid opening by sending written notification to the Director of Purchasing. Bids may be withdrawn after the bid opening only with written authorization from the Director of Purchasing.
11. **Defects or Irregularities in Bids:** The County reserves the right to waive any defect or irregularity in any bid received. In case of a discrepancy between unit prices and extended prices, the unit price will govern unless the facts or other considerations indicate another basis for correction of the discrepancy.
12. **Prices Held Firm:** Prices bid shall be firm for the period of the contract, unless otherwise specified in the contract. All prices bid for commodities, supplies, equipment, or other products shall be quoted FOB Destination, Fayette County or job site.
13. **Bidder Substitutions:** Bidders offering substitutions or deviations from specifications stated in the invitation to bid, shall list such substitutions or deviations on the "Exceptions to Specifications" sheet provided, or on a separate sheet to be submitted with the bid. The absence of such list shall indicate that the bidder has taken no exception to the specifications. The evaluation of bids and the determination as to equality and acceptability of products or services offered shall be at the discretion of the County.
14. **Non-Collusion:** By responding to this Invitation to Bid, the bidder represents that the bid is not made in connection with any competing bidder, supplier, or service provider submitting a separate response to this invitation to bid, and is in all respects fair and without collusion or fraud.
15. **Bid Evaluation:** Award will be made to the lowest responsive, responsible bidder, taking into consideration payment terms, vendor qualifications and experience, quality, references, any exceptions listed, and/or other factors deemed relevant in making the award. The County may make such investigation as it deems necessary to determine the ability of the bidder to perform, and the bidder shall furnish to the County all information and data for this purpose as the County may request. The County reserves the right to reject any bid item, any bid, or all bids, and to re-advertise for bids.
16. **Partial Award:** The County reserves the right to make award by item, by group of items, by any combination of items, or by lump sum award. The award will be made in the best interest of the County. Bidders may restrict their bids to consideration of a lump sum award or other restriction only by so indicating on the pricing sheet or the "Exceptions to Specifications" sheet included in the invitation to bid. Bidders who do not restrict consideration of their bids in this manner shall be expected to accept any portion of the bid awarded. The County reserves the right to award multiple contracts for the products or services sought by this invitation to bid.
17. **Payment Terms and Discounts:** The County's standard payment terms are Net 30. Any deviation from standard payment terms must be specified in the resulting contract, and both parties must agree on such deviation. Cash discounts offered will be a consideration in awarding the bid, but only if they give the County at least 15 days from receipt of invoice to pay. For taking discounts, time will

be computed from the date of invoice acceptance by the County, or the date a correct invoice is received, whichever is the later date. Payment is deemed made, for the purpose of earning the discount, on the date of the check.

18. **Trade Secrets – Confidentiality:** If any person or entity submits a bid or proposal that contains trade secrets, an affidavit shall be included with the bid or proposal. The affidavit shall declare the specific included information which constitutes trade secrets. Any trade secrets must be either (1) placed in a separate envelope, clearly identified and marked as such, or (2) at a minimum, marked in the affidavit or an attached document explaining exactly where such information is, and otherwise marked, highlighted, or made plainly visible. See O.C.G.A. § 50-18-72 (A)(34).
19. **Trade Secrets – Internal Use:** In submitting a bid, the bidder agrees that the County may reveal any trade secret materials contained in the bid to all County staff and officials involved in the selection process, and to any outside consultant or other third parties who may assist in the selection process. The bidder agrees to hold harmless the County and each of its officers, employees, and agents from all costs, damages, and expenses incurred in connection with refusing to disclose any material which the bidder has designated as a trade secret.
20. **Ethics – Disclosure of Relationships:** Before a proposed contract in excess of \$10,000.00 is recommended for award to the Board of Commissioners or the County Administrator, or before the County renews, extends, or otherwise modifies a contract after it has been awarded, the Contractor must disclose certain relationships with any County Commissioner or County Official, or their spouse, mother, father, grandparent, brother, sister, son or daughter related by blood, adoption, or marriage (including in-laws). A relationship that must be reported exists if any of these individuals is a director, officer, partner, or employee, or has a substantial financial interest in the business, as described in Fayette County Ordinance Chapter 2, Article IV, Division 3 (Code of Ethics).

If such relationship exists between your company and any individual mentioned above, relevant information must be presented in the form of a written letter to the Director of Purchasing. You must include the letter with any bid, proposal, or price quote you submit to the Purchasing Department.

In the event that a Contractor fails to comply with this requirement, the County will take action as appropriate to the situation, which may include actions up to and including rejection of the bid or offer, cancellation of the contract in question, or debarment or suspension from award of a County contract for a period of up to three years.
21. **Contract Execution & Notice to Proceed:** After the Board of Commissioners makes an award, all required documents are received by the County, and the contract is fully executed with signature of both parties, the County will issue a written Notice to Proceed. The County shall not be liable for payment of any work done or any costs incurred by any bidder prior to the County issuing the Notice to Proceed.
22. **Term of Contract:** The initial term of this agreement shall begin upon issuance of a Notice to Proceed and continue through June 30, 2027. Thereafter, this agreement may be renewed by the County for two additional one-year renewal terms (each a “Renewal Term” and together with the Initial Term, the “Term”), which renewal will be by letter or other written correspondence from the County to the Contractor ninety (90) days prior to expiration of the Initial Term or the then-current Renewal Term. If the County fails to provide notice of renewal, this Agreement will terminate at the end of the Initial Term or the then-current Renewal Term. This agreement is subject to the multi-year contractual provisions of O.C.G.A. 36-60-13(a).

23. **Unavailability of Funds:** This contract will terminate immediately and absolutely at such time as appropriated and otherwise unobligated funds are no longer available to satisfy the obligations of the County under the contract.
24. **Insurance:** The Successful Bidder shall procure and maintain the following insurance, to be in effect throughout the term of the contract, in at least the amounts and limits as follows:
 - a. **General Liability Insurance:** \$1,000,000 combined single limit per occurrence, including bodily and personal injury, destruction of property, and contractual liability.
 - b. **Automobile Liability Insurance:** \$1,000,000 combined single limit each occurrence, including bodily injury and property damage liability.
 - c. **Worker's Compensation & Employer's Liability Insurance:** Workers Compensation as required by Georgia statute.

Before a contract with the Successful Bidder is executed, the Successful Bidder shall provide Certificates of Insurance for all required coverage. The Successful Bidder can provide the Certificate of Insurance after award of the contract, but must be provided prior to execution of the contract document by both parties. The certificate shall list an additional insured as follows:

25. **Unauthorized Performance:** The County will not compensate the Contractor for work performed unless the work is authorized under the contract, as initially executed or as amended.
26. **Assignment of Contract:** Assignment of any contract resulting from this Invitation to Bid will not be authorized, except with express written authorization from the County.
27. **Indemnification:** The Contractor shall indemnify and save the County and all its officers, agents and employees harmless from all suits, actions, or other claims of any character, name and description brought for or on account of any damages, losses, or expenses to the extent caused by or resulting from the negligence, recklessness, or intentionally wrongful conduct of the Contractor or other persons employed or utilized by the Contractor in the performance of the contract. The Contractor shall pay any judgment with cost which may be obtained against the County growing out of such damages, losses, or expenses.
28. **Severability:** The invalidity of one or more of the phrases, sentences, clauses or sections contained in the contract shall not affect the validity of the remaining portion of the contract. If any provision of the contract is held to be unenforceable, then both parties shall be relieved of all obligations arising under such provision to the extent that the provision is unenforceable. In such case, the contract shall be deemed amended to the extent necessary to make it enforceable while preserving its intent.
29. **Delivery Failures:** If the Contractor fails to deliver contracted goods or services within the time specified in the contract, or fails to replace rejected items in a timely manner, the County shall have authority to make open-market purchases of comparable goods or services. The County shall have the right to invoice the Contractor for any excess expenses incurred, or deduct such amount from monies owed the Contractor. Such purchases shall be deducted from contracted quantities.

30. **Termination for Cause:** The County may terminate the contract for cause by sending written notice to the Contractor of the Contractor's default in the performance of any term of this agreement. As appropriate, the County will compensate the Contractor for completed performance, and for any partially completed performance as determined by the County to be adequately performed. Termination shall be without prejudice to any of the County's rights or remedies by law.
31. **Termination for Convenience:** The County may terminate the contract for its convenience at any time with 10 days' written notice to the Contractor. In the event of termination for convenience, the County will pay the Contractor for services performed. The County will compensate partially completed performance based upon a signed statement of completion submitted by the Contractor, which shall itemize each element of performance completed.
32. **Force Majeure:** Neither party shall be deemed to be in breach of the contract to the extent that performance of its obligations is delayed, restricted, or prevented by reason of any act of God, natural disaster, act of government, or any other act or condition beyond the reasonable control of the party in question.
33. **Governing Law:** This agreement shall be governed in accordance with the laws of the State of Georgia. The parties agree to submit to the jurisdiction in Georgia, and further agree that any cause of action arising under this agreement shall be required to be brought in the appropriate venue in Fayette County, Georgia.
34. **Open Records Act:** In the event that the Contractor receives, and responds to, a request for information as provided in Georgia's Open Records Act (O.C.G.A. § 50-18-70 *et seq.*), the Contractor shall promptly provide the County the same information provided to the initiator of the request for information. Contractor shall email such information to the county's Custodian of Records at tsmith@fayettecountyga.gov.

INTRODUCTION:

Fayette County, Georgia is seeking bids for an annual contract of grass mowing services for our Justice Center property grounds.

SCOPE OF WORK FOR THE JUSTICE CENTER:

The scope of services listed below are required for all locations. Included herein are special requirements for each individual location that shall be included along with these services.

1. Contractor shall have a minimum' of 3 years' experience in cutting like/similar properties, including grass cutting, pruning, leaf removal, and pine strawing. All contractors' references shall reflect the example given above or they will not be considered as qualified according to our specifications.
2. A Category 24 Pesticide Contractors License is required for the spraying of herbicides as needed. Proof of this license is required for contractors to qualify for this bid. Area to be Sprayed shall be no more than 3 inches around poles, signs, rocks, fence lines, and other fixed objects.
3. The Contractor will be responsible for any damage done by crew, which includes but not limited to damages to fencing, signs, structures, etc. All damages shall be reported to the Fayette County Maintenance Department, immediately.
4. The Contractor must use commercial type grass cutting equipment with mulching blades and necessary equipment to attach to mowers to vacuum areas as necessary. Rotary, Reel, and Cylinder mowers are all acceptable as long as they are a Commercial Mower, NOTE that all zero turn mowers are not commercial.
5. The Contractor shall be responsible for all labor, and equipment needed to complete this work.
6. The Contractor, prior to cutting grass, shall pick up all trash in the cutting area and dispose of it in the dumpster. The Grounds Maintenance maintains the area periodically throughout the week, but the contractor is responsible for picking up any ground liter and disposing of it in a trash can or dumpster before cutting so that the trash is not cut up. If this happens the contractor will be required to clean up their mess.
7. Fayette County personnel will perform periodic inspection of work done by the Contractor.
8. The Contractor is responsible for their personnel on County property. There is a tobacco/vaping policy that prohibits the use of any tobacco products or vaping apparatuses at all county property and facilities. There is to be NO SMOKING AT ALL of any kind on the grounds or in buildings on County property.
9. Boundary lines are not accurate; the map is just used to show the approximate area to be cut. The Contractor is responsible to get with the Grounds Maintenance Department to get exact boundaries.
10. Mowing patterns shall be rotated each week to prevent compaction and visible tire patterns.
11. Subcontracting is not allowed for grass cutting services.

SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS FOR THIS LOCATION

1. Cutting:
 - a. The contractor may cut the entire property on Friday after 5pm, or on Saturday or Sunday if time allows, if this is preferred. If the schedule is changed due to weather or other events beyond the control of the contractor, the contractor shall contact Fayette County Maintenance Department as soon as possible. Cutting shall not be done Monday through Thursday. If the contractor cannot perform one complete cut during the time allowed, due to weather, the scheduled cutting that was not performed shall be deducted from that month's invoice.
 - b. During the active growing season, turf grass shall be cut to no more than 2” in height, edged, weeded, blown down, and excess grass clippings shall be removed weekly.
 - c. Map of the property is attached and area to be maintained is outline in red, and approximate.
2. Spraying:
 - a. Spray in between the asphalt and concrete (the gutters) for weeds when needed around the entire parking lot including the parking islands.
 - b. The pine straw beds must be sprayed as needed to keep them weed free, as well as all brick paver and sidewalk area around the entrance to the building.
3. Pruning:
 - a. Prune shrubs three (3) times a year, any additional pruning will be requested by the Maintenance Department
4. Grounds Maintenance:
 - a. During winter months (or dormant season), cut as needed and blow leaves every week. Leaves may be blown and feathered out into the woods but not piled up.
 - b. Prune limbs from trees in the parking area and along roadways that need to be limbed up with clippings being disposed of properly.
5. Pine Straw:
 - a. The contractor is to furnish and put out pine straw two (2) times a year. The spreading of pine straw shall be completed once in late winter and once in early summer. 450 bales shall be used for each application for a total of 900 bales per year. Excess pine straw shall be returned to Fayette County.

b. Pine straw must be priced separately for the two (2) applications (total of 900 bales per year) as listed on the pricing sheet, included herein.

c. Pine straw shall be used around:

- the Justice Center Building
- around the water fountain
- both the entrance and exit beds
- all ornamental islands
- around the trees on both the entrance and exit roadways

d. Fayette County will be responsible for mulching around ornamental trees that stand alone around the entire parking area

SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS FOR THIS LOCATION

1. The property is to be cut all the way through weekly. Successful bidder must start on Monday and be finished by Friday. If the contractor is not able to cut during that week, due to weather, the scheduled cutting that was not performed shall be deducted from that month's invoice. If schedule is changed due to weather or other events beyond the control of the successful bidder, the successful bidder shall contact the Fayette County Maintenance Department.
2.
 - a. During the active growing season, grass shall be cut to a maximum of 2", edged, weedeated, blown down, and excess grass clippings shall be scattered or removed depending on thickness of the grass clippings weekly. If there are any questions as to whether the area needs to have clippings scattered or removed, then the final decision will be made by a county representative.
 - b. Hard surfaces such as concrete curbing shall be weedeated/edged.
 - c. Hard surfaces such as concrete walkways, pavilions, tee boxes shall be weedeated/edged.
 - d. Any clippings blown on to hard surfaces or onto sport fields shall be blown off.
3.
 - a. Spray in between the asphalt and concrete (the gutters) for weeds when needed around the entire parking lot including the parking islands. The pine strawed beds must be sprayed as needed to keep them weed free, as well as all concrete and sidewalk area around the entrance to the building.
 - b. Area to be sprayed shall be no more than 3-inches around poles, signs, rocks, fence lines, and other field objects. Anything larger shall result in no spraying being allowed by the contractor.
4. Fayette county will be responsible for mulching.

- c) The Contractor will notify the public employer in the event the Contractor ceases to utilize the federal work authorization program during the contract period, including renewals or extensions thereof;
- d) The Contractor understands that ceasing to utilize the federal work authorization program constitutes a material breach of Contract;
- e) The Contractor will contract for the performance of services in satisfaction of such contract only with subcontractors who present an affidavit to the Contractor with the information required by O.C.G.A. § 13-10-91(a), (b), and (c);
- f) The Contractor acknowledges and agrees that this Affidavit shall be incorporated into any contract(s) subject to the provisions of O.C.G.A. § 13-10- 91 for the project listed below to which Contractor is a party after the date hereof without further action or consent by Contractor; and
- g) Contractor acknowledges its responsibility to submit copies of any affidavits, drivers' licenses, and identification cards required pursuant to O.C.G.A. § 13-10-91 to the public employer within five business days of receipt.
