



8. Ability to coordinate the county’s feedback directly with its legislative delegation.

**While the Georgia General Assembly is in session, County Legislative Coordinators are encouraged to:**

- Monitor and evaluate ACCG's weekly Legislative Update, occasional Action Alerts, and Facebook Live updates, if possible, for their impact on county government operations.
- Disseminate these updates and alerts to appropriate county officials and staff, ensuring that ACCG's bill summaries and positions are known.
- Initiate and coordinate your county's response and feedback on issues to ACCG. While ACCG sometimes specifically solicits feedback, feel free to provide input on any issue at any time.
- Initiate and coordinate your county's response on issues to your local legislative delegation.
- Inform county commissioners, officials and staff on how to use the ACCG legislative tracking feature on our website at [www.accg.org](http://www.accg.org).
- Receive and appropriately disseminate ACCG's notification when local legislation is introduced impacting your county.
- Work to strengthen the relationship and communication between your Board of Commissioners and your local legislative delegation.
- Maintain direct contact information for your local legislative delegation.

**The County Legislative Coordinator ideally should have:**

- Access to all department heads and county officials to obtain information and data.
- Access to the Board of Commissioners.

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Welcome to the meeting of your Fayette County Board of Commissioners. Your participation in County government is appreciated. All regularly scheduled Board meetings are open to the public and are held on the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> Thursday of each month at 6:30 p.m.

**Call to Order**

Chairman Randy Ognio called the December 12, 2019 Board of Commissioners meeting to order at 2:00 p.m. A quorum of the Board was present. Commission Rousseau was absent from the meeting.

**Invocation and Pledge of Allegiance by Vice Chairman Charles Oddo**

Vice Chairman Charles Oddo offered the Invocation and led the Board and audience in the Pledge of Allegiance.

**Acceptance of Agenda**

Vice Chairman Oddo moved to accept the agenda as written. Commissioner Gibbons seconded. The motion passed 4-0. Commission Rousseau was absent from the meeting.

**PROCLAMATION/RECOGNITION:**

1. **Recognition of the retirement of Chief Finance Officer Mary Parrott for 17 1/2 years of service to Fayette County.**  
County Administrator Steve Rapson, on behalf of the Board, congratulated Mary Parrott on her retirement. He expressed his appreciation for her 17 1/2 years of service to Fayette County.
2. **Recognition of the retirement of Building Safety Director Joe Scarborough for 18 1/2 years of service to Fayette County.**  
County Administrator Steve Rapson, on behalf of the Board, congratulated Joe Scarborough on his retirement. He expressed his appreciation for his 18 1/2 years of service to Fayette County.
3. **Presentation, at the request of Chairman Randy Ognio, from Atlanta Regional Commission (ARC) regarding the Atlanta Region's Plan update for 2020.**

Center for Livable Communities Director Mike Alexander with the Atlanta Regional Commission (ARC) presented the Atlanta Region's Plan update for 2020, along with Rob Lebeau, Workforce Solutions Manager also with the Atlanta Regional Commission (ARC) who presented Workforce Services Fayette County-Overview.

Mr. Alexander expressed his appreciation to the Board for the opportunity to present the Atlanta Region's Plan update for 2020. Mr. Alexander continued stating that this presentation was a primer of the work of the Atlanta Regional Commission (ARC). Mr. Alexander stated that the ARC was updating the regional plan and that it was expected to be adopted February 2020. Mr. Alexander stated that the Atlanta Region's Plan is a comprehensive overview of the work

the ARC does with all the local governments in the metro Atlanta area. He continued stating that the Atlanta Region's Plan laid out how the ARC expect, specifically regarding transportation infrastructure and design, to plan for and meet challenges associated in the forecast being presented today. Mr. Alexander stated that the Atlanta Regional Commission (ARC) goal was to be very transparent and that the Atlanta Region's Plan update for 2020 along with interactive tools was available online for public review. Mr. Alexander stated that the Atlanta Regional Commission (ARC) surveys over 5000 people each year across the region asking them their perceptions of how metropolitan Atlanta was doing, he added that they were able to get those results down to County significance allowing the County to see an overview of residents perception of how the County is doing. Mr. Alexander stated that at the County level in the past the biggest issue for citizens was the economy, coming out of the recession. Mr. Alexander stated that since then as the economy began to revive metropolitan Atlanta citizens' critical issue changed to transportation, which remained true for 28% of Fayette County citizens as well. Mr. Alexander stated that as depicted in the forecast, as the decade ended, Metropolitan Atlanta will continue to be a national leader in total population change; he added, that the Atlanta Regional Commission (ARC) expected Atlanta to finish in the top 5 as of 2019. Mr. Alexander stated that Metropolitan Atlanta was the fourth fastest growing metropolitan in the United States which really impacted how they made long range forecasts. Mr. Alexander stated that the forecast extends out 35 years to 2050 where they expect metropolitan Atlanta to grow by about 2.9M people. Mr. Alexander stated that this sets the tone for how much infrastructure will need to be developed. Mr. Alexander stated that upon analysis the Atlanta Regional Commission (ARC) realized that a major focus was housing affordability as a regional issue he continued stating that as a whole, metropolitan Atlanta, is affordable. However, compounded with transportation, cost for middle income households, metropolitan Atlanta, which includes Fayette County, was near the top of the pack for total costs. Mr. Alexander discussed home price changes, regional office space and how employment centers continue to grow. Mr. Alexander stated that the Atlanta Regional Commission (ARC) reviewed where people lived, worked, and how they commuted, impacted transportation infrastructure. Mr. Alexander discussed population forecast and noted that Fayette County was expected to grow by 36,703 people through 2050. Mr. Alexander discussed employment forecasted and stated that because of aging, healthcare was expected to add the most jobs over this forecast period in metropolitan Atlanta, he added that that trend would trickle down to the local level in Fayette County, with healthcare jobs leading the charts in growth. Mr. Alexander stated that within the Atlanta Region's Plan there had been discussion of what they proposed to build especially regarding transportation infrastructure, he added that two key benchmarks that had to be evaluated for projects included if the project would receive federal funding and the individual projects potential impact to the regional air quality. Mr. Alexander stated that express lane corridors are the backbone to the expansion. Mr. Alexander stated that demand management, expansion, maintenance & modernization were all major factors included in the Atlanta Region's Plan. Mr. Alexander discussed the estimated revenues through 2050 highlighting the various funding sources to include federal, state, local and private funding, he added that this plan's total revenue was expected to be \$172.6 billion. Mr. Alexander discussed the regionally important performance measures stating that with 8.6 million residents expected in the region by 2050, roadway capacity projects for personal vehicles alone will not be able to meet the demand for a safe, accessible, and convenient transportation system. He stated the objective is to maintain and operate the existing transportation system, to provide reliable travel. Mr. Alexander stated with the anticipated growth, transportation cost would be dramatically less with the Atlanta Region's Plan in place. Mr. Alexander discussed how the Atlanta Regional Commission (ARC) continues to support the Livable Centers Initiative, where local communities' downtown centers are more walkable, vibrant, and connected. Mr. Alexander thanked the Board for their time, attention, and interest in the ARC's Atlanta Region's Plan update.

Rob Lebeau Workforce Solutions Manager discussed Workforce Services in Fayette County. Mr. Lebeau stated that Workforce Development is an interconnected set of solutions to meet local employment needs. Mr. Lebeau stated that Fayette County was a part of Region 3 Local Workforce Development Area. Mr. Lebeau stated that Workforce had two core customers they serviced: job seekers which are individuals who are looking to be retrained or start in the workforce for the first time; and businesses which are employers seeking to fulfil their employment needs. Mr. Lebeau stated that Workforce service delivery approach was provided via eight (8) Career Resource Centers: one full-service one-stop

center and seven (7) affiliate centers, he added that Workforce had one mobile unit, ten (10) Youth Programs, and Business Services which included work based learning and recruitment & expansion. Mr. Lebeau stated that there was two local center in Fayette County where individual could receive services, one was the Career Resource Center located in Magnolia Office Park at 500 West Lanier Ave, Suite 707 Fayetteville, GA 30214 the hours of operation are Tuesday – Thursday from 8:00 a.m. – 5:00 p.m. Mr. Lebeau stated that the second center was Eckerd Connects which specifically focused on youths between the ages of 16- 24 to provide services, training, and potential job placement. Eckerd Connects is located at 1572 Highway 85, Suite 338 Fayetteville, GA 30214. Mr. Lebeau stated that the future goal for the career centers (both for adults and youths) was to increase participant numbers and potential outreach. Mr. Lebeau stated that Workforce -Business Services were services geared towards job seeks, he added stating that Workforce works diligently with local business to determine what their workforce needs are and how to assist in meeting those needs. Mr. Lebeau stated that one incentive that Workforce offers to businesses was on the job training, where Workforce would provide up to 90% of a position salary for up to six months as long as the job seeker is receiving on the job training with the intent that the employee learned the job well enough to remain on permanently. Mr. Lebeau stated that Workforce also offers incumbent worker training which is when an existing employees are trained for a new position/role or a new piece of equipment depending on the industry, Workforce in that case would pay up to 50% of the training cost for those individuals who learned the new skill, Mr. Lebeau stated that the only requirement was that individuals who successfully completed the training would receive a pay increase as a result of mastering a new skill. Mr. Lebeau thanked the Board for their time and the opportunity to speak to the citizens of Fayette County informing about the many service made available by Workforce.

Commissioner Gibbons seconded. The motion passed 4-0. Commissioner Rousseau was absent.

9. **Approval of the four (4) 2017 SPLOST Corridor Studies: Banks Road, Sandy Creek Road, Tyrone & Palmetto Roads and SR 279.**

Commissioner Maxwell asked for clarification on what the Board was approving regarding item #9.

Phil Mallon Public Works Director stated that item #9 was the four (4) Corridor Studies. Board approval signified that these projects had been reviewed and are potential projects that the County would want to complete in the future. Board approval also provides staff and the public with guidance on the project the Board feels are needed and that they generally support.

Chairman Ognio stated that this approval provides a list of potential projects that the Board supports setting the County up to be able to receive funding via grants and/or federal aid. Chairman Ognio stated that the Atlanta Regional Commission (ARC) was very big on corridor studies and encouraged county participation in them.

Mr. Mallon stated that the intent of the four (4) 2017 SPLOST Corridor Studies presentation at the November Board of Commissioners meeting was to provide the Board with an overview of each study for review. Mr. Mallon added that that was also during the 30-day public comment period for citizen feedback. Mr. Mallon stated that as a part of the public comment period they received an abundance of comments regarding the Tyrone & Palmetto roads study which resulted in a change. Mr. Mallon stated that the Tyrone & Palmetto roads study recommended a phased in widening of all of Tyrone and Palmetto roads, however the elected officials along with citizens who lived in the area, did not want road widening. Mr. Mallon continued stating that in taking all viewpoints into consideration the recommendation made was to only widen between State Route 54 and Dogwood Road which is within unincorporated Fayette County and had the highest need and for the remaining sections the recommendation was to provide operational and safety improvements.

Commissioner Maxwell moved to approve three (3) 2017 SPLOST Studies: Banks Road, Sandy Creek Road, Tyrone & Palmetto Roads. Commissioner Gibbons seconded. The motion passed 4-0. Commissioner Rousseau was absent.

Vice Chairman Oddo moved to approve 2017 SPLOST Corridor Studies for SR 279. Chairman Ognio seconded. The motion passed 3-1, with Commissioner Maxwell voting in opposition. Commissioner Rousseau was absent.

10. **Approval of the Fayette County's 2019 Comprehensive Transportation Plan and Path Design Guidelines.**

Mr. Mallon stated that item #10 was the Comprehensive Transportation Plan which was a guideline that identified existing conditions, assessed need, and provided recommendations of projects. Board approval signified that the projects had been reviewed and are potential projects that the County would want to complete. Board approval also provides staff and the public with insight on the project that the Board feel are needed and that they generally support.

Commissioner Maxwell asked if there had been any projects removed from the Comprehensive Transportation Plan.

Mr. Mallon confirmed yes, that the TDK connection project was pulled from the plan along with various path projects at the request of City of Peachtree City. Mr. Mallon stated, however, the Hood Avenue bridge rebuild project had not been removed from the Comprehensive Transportation Plan. Mr. Mallon continued stating that in discussions with the City of Fayetteville they did desire to keep that project a part of the plan.

Commissioner Maxwell stated that he recalled in April of 2019 expressing citizen concern and desire not to have the Hood Avenue bridge rebuilt, with a petition signed by about 50 residents on Hood Avenue expressing their wishes. Commissioner Maxwell also asked if the Airport off Lester Road project had been removed.

Mr. Mallon stated that that project was not removed but updated and project was changed to a path and not a road connection.

Commissioner Maxwell asked to have the Hood Avenue bridge rebuild project removed.

Mr. Rapson stated that in his conversations with the residents on Hood Avenue they expressed being open to a pedestrian bridge but opposed to a bridge that would transport vehicles, he added that removing the project from the Comprehensive Transportation Plan would essential remove access for funding via State or Federal dollars.

Commissioner Gibbons stated that the way he understood this item was that it was not a binding document but a series of recommendations provided via staff, expert consultants, and citizens input listing potential transportation projects for future review.

Chairman Ognio stated that he feels the Board should work in coordination with the municipalities, the City of Fayetteville asked to keep this project in the Comprehensive Transportation Plan and the Board should honor their wishes.

Vice-Chairman Oddo stated that along with working in coordination with the municipalities, the Board should keep in mind that Fayette County continues to grow. Vice-Chairman stated that the Board should plan now and keep options open and assessable for future changes which include funding availability. Vice-Chairman stated that from a County perspective he wouldn't want to remove options that could benefit the County as a whole in the future.

Vice Chairman Oddo moved to approve the Fayette County's 2019 Comprehensive Transportation Plan and Path Design Guidelines. Chairman Ognio seconded. The motion passed 3-1, with Commissioner Maxwell voting in opposition. Commissioner Rousseau was absent.

11. **Approval of staff's recommendation for Board of Commissioners to approve the bid from Pavement Technology, Inc. for Bid #1737-B Asphalt Rejuvenation for Various Roads in the amount of \$116,886.02.**

13. **Consideration of the Parks and Recreation Selection Committee's recommendation to re-appoint Charles McCollum to the Recreation Commission for a term beginning immediately and expiring August 31, 2023.**

Commissioner Gibbons moved to approve Parks and Recreation Selection Committee's recommendation to re-appoint Charles McCollum to the Recreation Commission for a term beginning immediately and expiring August 31, 2023. Vice-Chairman Oddo seconded. The motion passed 4-0. Commissioner Rousseau was absent.

14. **Consideration of a recommendation of the Selection Committee comprised of Vice Chairman Charles W. Oddo and Commissioner Charles D. Rousseau to appoint Bruce Donaghey, contingent on his resignation with the Tax Assessor's office, to the Board of Assessor to serve an unexpired term beginning immediately and expiring December 31, 2021.**

Vice Chairman Oddo moved to approve to appoint Bruce Donaghey, contingent on his resignation with the Tax Assessor's office, to the Board of Assessor to serve an unexpired term beginning immediately and expiring December 31, 2021. Commissioner Gibbons seconded. The motion passed 4-0. Commissioner Rousseau was absent.

15. **Consideration of Environmental Management and Building Safety's recommendation to transfer the currently unfilled Environmental Management Department Environmental Technicians (Grade 15) position to Building Safety as a Building Inspector I (Grade 16).**

Environmental Management Director Bryan Keller stated that Environmental Management and Building Safety strived to provide the citizens of Fayette County with cost efficient and streamlined processes for residential home inspections. Mr. Keller stated that with recent staff changes in the Environmental Management Department an opportunity arose to better service the citizens of the county. Mr. Keller added that currently all residential erosion and sediment control inspections were conducted by the Environmental Management Department. These sites must be inspected when a complaint is received and at least 3 times during the construction process per the County's National Pollution Discharge and Elimination System (NPDES) Permit and Metropolitan North Georgia Water Planning District requirements. Mr. Keller stated that the sites must also be inspected per the County's agreement with the Georgia Environmental Protection Division to maintain Local Issuing Authority status. As of 11/13/2019 there were 123 residential site Environmental Management Inspections. Mr. Keller continued stating that by transferring this position is intended to shift the residential erosion and sediment control inspections to all building inspectors. Mr. Keller stated that this would eliminate the need for multiple inspectors from multiple departments to conduct inspection of residential sites and results in fewer erosion and sedimentation violation since building inspectors are on site more frequently than the Environmental Management Department. These inspections take minimal time if an inspector is already on site

Commissioner Gibbons moved to approve Environmental Management and Building Safety's recommendation to transfer the currently unfilled Environmental Management Department Environmental Technicians (Grade 15) position to Building Safety as a Building Inspector I (Grade 16). Vice Chairman Oddo seconded. The motion passed 4-0. Commissioner Rousseau was absent.

16. **Consideration of staff's recommendation to transfer \$22,160.00 from the Vehicle Replacement Fund to purchase a new F150 for the newly transferred Building Inspector I.**

Commissioner Gibbons suggested reviewing other department who may be in need of a new vehicle, transferring the used vehicle to the Department of Building Safety for the Building Inspector position.

Mr. Rapson agreed stating that a vehicle replacement review was typically performed.

Vice Chairman Oddo moved to approve staff's recommendation to transfer \$22,160.00 from the Vehicle Replacement Fund to purchase a new F150 for the newly transferred Building Inspector I. Commissioner Gibbons seconded. The motion passed 4-0. Commissioner Rousseau was absent.

17. **Consideration of staff's recommendation to award Bid No. 1598-B Chlorine Dioxide Generation System to the low bidder, Lakeshore Engineering in the amount of \$934,080.00, and Task Order FC-20-05 under Contract No. 1221-P Water System Engineer of Record for construction management in the amount of \$184,173.00.**

Water System Director Vanessa Tigert stated that The Chlorine Dioxide Generation System construction project would upgrade the current system at South Fayette Water Treatment Plant, she continued stating that Chlorine Dioxide is used to disinfect water during the treatment process. Ms. Tigert stated that the current obsolete system used chlorine gas to feed directly to the water being treated and could allow for generation of excess levels of unwanted disinfection by-products as well as operator safety concerns. Ms. Tigert stated that this new system would use a solution of sodium chlorate, hydrogen peroxide and sulfuric acid to produce the chlorine dioxide. Ms. Tigert stated that no chlorine gas is used or produced in this process, significantly reducing by-product and operator safety concerns. Ms. Tigert stated that Lakeshore Engineering was the lowest bidder at \$934,080.00 and Jacobs the Water System Engineer of Record proposed to perform the construction management for \$184,173.00 totaling \$1,118,253 which was below the funded amount approved by the Board in 2018 for this Capital Improvement Project.

Commissioner Maxwell expressed his appreciation for the Water System quick response to recent incident.

Commissioner Maxwell asked for future review if the Water Systems would continue to need CH2M services to manage or could those services now be fulfilled in-house.

Commissioner Gibbons moved to approve staff's recommendation to award Bid No. 1598-B Chlorine Dioxide Generation System to the low bidder, Lakeshore Engineering in the amount of \$934,080.00, and Task Order FC-20-05 under Contract No. 1221-P Water System Engineer of Record for construction management in the amount of \$184,173.00. Vice-Chairman Oddo seconded. The motion passed 4-0. Commissioner Rousseau was absent.

18. **Consideration of staff's recommendation to award Contract 1751-B, Veterans Parkway at SR 92 - Signalization to Southeastern Site Development, Inc. for the amount of \$658,038.97 (2004 SPLOST R-5F).**

Mr. Mallon stated that the award of this contract would begin lane work, grading work, and installation of the traffic signal.

Vice-Chairman Oddo moved to award Contract 1751-B, Veterans Parkway at SR 92 - Signalization to Southeastern Site Development, Inc. for the amount of \$658,038.97 (2004 SPLOST R-5F). Chairman Ognio seconded. The motion passed 4-0. Commissioner Rousseau was absent.

19. **Consideration of the County Attorney's recommendation to deny a disposition of tax refund, as requested by David Jerard, for tax years 2009-2016.**

County Attorney Dennis Davenport stated that Mr. David Jerard acquired his residence in Peachtree City on May 21, 2008. In 2017 he appealed the assessed value of his residence. The resulting research by the Assessor's Office led to the removal of finished basement square footage from his property record card for tax year 2017 and forward. Mr. Davenport stated that Mr. Jerard is requesting a refund of taxes assessed upon the finished basement for tax years prior to 2017. Mr. Davenport stated that the property was correctly recorded as a residence with a finished basement in the

records of the assessors. Mr. Davenport stated that on March 14, 2018, during a 2017 tax appeal, Mr. Jerard presented evidence of significant water damage to the finished basement. The damage to the basement was so complete that it triggered a full removal of "finished basement" square footage from the property record card. Mr. Davenport stated that the damage caused the assessors to conclude that the basement area no longer qualified as "finished" for valuation purposes. The appeal was ended, and the property record card was updated. The billing for tax year 2017 was adjusted accordingly. Mr. Davenport stated that a denial of refund is recommended for all tax years prior to 2016 based on the three-year statute of limitations. Mr. Davenport stated that a denial of refund for tax year 2016 is recommended based upon failure to establish an error or illegality in the record of assessment.

Vice-Chairman Oddo moved to deny a disposition of tax refund, as requested by David Jerard, for tax years 2009-2016. Commissioner Gibbons seconded. The motion passed 4-0. Commissioner Rousseau was absent.

**20. Consideration of the County Attorney's recommendation to approve a disposition of tax refund, as requested by Kevin and Cynthia Haggins, for tax year 2018 in the amount of \$352.37.**

Mr. Davenport stated that Kevin and Cynthia Haggins are requesting a refund of property taxes paid on their residence in Fayetteville for tax years 2017 and 2018. Mr. Davenport continued stating that the Haggins family acquired this property on April 29, 2016. At that time, the property record card for the property included a basement. Mr. Haggins claims that the residence does not include a basement. Construction of the residence at 210 Broadwater Drive was completed in 2016. Mr. Davenport stated that at that time the assessors created a property record card for the property that included a basement. Mr. Davenport added that in tax year 2019, the Haggins noticed a basement was listed on the property record card. They reported the issue to the assessors. A site visit to the property confirmed that no basement existed at this residence. Mr. Davenport stated that the property record card was updated to reflect this information for 2019 and all tax years thereafter. Mr. Davenport stated that although the basement was present on the property record card for 2017, it was not a factor in establishing the fair market value used for the assessment of taxes for 2017. Instead, the assessors relied upon the 2016 sales price of the property to establish fair market value, a methodology authorized under law. No error was made in assessing the 2017 property taxes. Therefore, a denial of the refund requested for tax year 2017 will be recommended. Mr. Davenport stated however, a refund would be recommended for 2018. In that year, the facts found on the property record card were used to calculate the fair market value of the property upon which the assessment was based. Mr. Davenport stated that the card included a basement that was not present on this property. The inclusion of the basement was an error in the record of the 2018 assessment.

Mr. Haggins expressed his concerns and frustrations regarding his property assessment and suggested that the process of how residents are assessed be reviewed. Mr. Haggins requested his 2018 taxes assessment be approved and asked that the 2017 assessment be considered also.

Commissioner Gibbons moved to approve to approve a disposition of tax refund, as requested by Kevin and Cynthia Haggins, for tax year 2018 in the amount of \$352.37. Vice-Chairman Oddo seconded. The motion passed 4-0. Commissioner Rousseau was absent.

**21. Consideration of the County Attorney's recommendation to approve a disposition of tax refund, as requested by Mathias H. and Suzanne M. Thernes, for tax years 2016, 2017 and 2018 for an aggregate amount of \$1,052.05.**

Mr. Davenport stated that Mr. Mathias H. and Ms. Suzanne M. Thernes purchased their residence at in Peachtree City on December 13, 1989. At that time the house was recorded as a 2,794 square foot residence. Mr. Davenport stated that in preparing to sale the home in the summer of 2019, the residence was measured for appraisal and found to be 2,287

square feet. The Thernes, based upon the 507 square foot discrepancy and as trustees for the living trust in which the home is titled, request a partial refund of taxes paid on the residence since their 1989 acquisition.

Mr. Davenport stated that the Thernes did not become aware of the error until 2019, 30 years post acquisition of property. Mr. Davenport stated that the provisions of the refund statute provide a taxpayer with a limited three-year window within which refunds can be attained to redress errors in the property record card. The provisions of the refund statute are to be interpreted in strict compliance with the language set forth by the state legislature. As such, a denial of refund is recommended for tax year 2015 and all years previous thereto. Mr. Davenport stated that these years are time barred by a statute of limitations. Mr. Davenport stated that tax year of 1989 is time barred and the property did not belong to the Thernes on the date of assessment for that year, January 1, 1989. As they were not the party responsible for property the tax payment in 1989, they are not entitled to refund.

Vice-Chairman Oddo moved to approve to approve a disposition of tax refund, as requested by Mathias and Suzanne Thernes, for tax years 2016, 2017 and 2018 for an aggregate amount of \$1,052.05. Commissioner Gibbons seconded. The motion passed 4-0. Commissioner Rousseau was absent.

**22. Consideration of the County Attorney's recommendation to approve a disposition of tax refund, as requested by Waymon Ahart, for tax year 2018 in the amount of \$1,350.32.**

Mr. Davenport stated that the Assessor's' office is requesting a partial refund of 2018 taxes on behalf of Mr. Waymon Ahart. Mr. Davenport stated that upon discovery of a misapplication of Mr. Ahart's L3 homestead, this request was initiated. Mr. Davenport stated that a qualified applicant for L3 homestead exemption is entitled to a fifty percent school tax exemption. Mr. Ahart applied for an L3 homestead exemption on August 23, 2017. Mr. Davenport stated that at that time, he was found to qualify for the exemption. He was over age 65 and fell within a qualifying income bracket. Mr. Davenport stated that his application for homestead misidentified his tax parcel number. As such, the exemption was not applied to his 2018 tax bill. Mr. Davenport stated that Mr. Ahart was found to be eligible for the L3 exemption in 2017 but, an error in the record caused the failure of application. The absence of the exemption led to a substantial increase in tax liability for 2018. The error has been corrected for the 2019 and all future tax years. Mr. Davenport stated that Approval of the requested refund is recommended to amend this error.

Commissioner Gibbons moved to approve a disposition of tax refund, as requested by Waymon Ahart, for tax year 2018 in the amount of \$1,350.32. Vice-Chairman Oddo seconded. The motion passed 4-0. Commissioner Rousseau was absent.

County Administrator Steve Rapson presented the Hot Project Updates

#### **Dogwood Trail (11/14/2019)**

Dogwood Trail is currently closed to all thru-traffic. Utility relocation remains the primary construction activity. Comcast is currently on-site and are anticipating an additional two weeks of work. Much of the utility work is sequential, which extends the time needed for all utilities to be relocated. The temporary water bypass line is complete and passed the pressure test on 10/23/19. The project remains on-schedule for the road to open in Spring 2020.

#### **Starr's Mill Tunnel (11/14/19)**

This project is for the construction of a multi-use path tunnel under Redwine Road, immediately south of the Robinson Road intersection. The project includes new path construction along the west side of Redwine Road and Robinson Road to connect with existing paths. County and PTC staff met with the Consultant on September 30 to identify field issues and establish design criteria. A revised Task Order from the Consultant is being reviewed by County staff.

#### **Old Senoia Road Culvert Replacement (11/14/2019)**

Old Senoia Road is scheduled to re-open by the end of the day Friday November 15th, 2019 once traffic striping is complete. Traffic may be reduced to one lane in the coming weeks as the contractor completes guardrail installation and site cleanup, expect minimal delays.

#### **Intersection of SR 92, Veterans Parkway and Westbridge Road (11/14/19)**

This intersection, currently operating as a two-way stop, has been approved for a traffic signal with turn lanes. Design for the project and right-of-way acquisition is complete. Fayette County received quotes for the concrete strain poles and coordination between Fayette County, GDOT and utility companies are underway regarding the types of poles to support the signal equipment. The invitation to bid package for construction is currently being advertised. Bids are due November 26, 2019.

#### **Interchange Project at SR 74 and I-85 (11/14/19)**

This project is in right of way acquisition stage and appraisals are currently being prepared. The construction let date is Summer 2021. There are no funding shortfalls at this point.

#### **East Fayetteville Bypass (11/14/19)**

The critical path for construction runs through the 700-ft bridge design for the crossing of Morning Creek. Currently staff is working with multiple property owners, GA Power, GDOT, the USACOE and the project team to get access to the bridge area for subsurface investigations.

#### **Morning Dove Drive Culvert Replacement (11/14/2019)**

The Morning Dove Drive culvert replacement project kicked off this month. The contractor, Piedmont Paving, has completed all clearing activities, erosion control measures, and installation of the new waterline. The culvert sections have been delivered to the site and culvert construction is expected to begin by next week.
