Old Business:

- Multi-use Pathways
 - Planning and Zoning has formed a committee to discuss the issue and Anita is on the committee.
 - Redwine Road is the first priority
 - A map will be developed of the proposed pathways
- Fireworks in county parks
 - County Attorney to incorporate the Recreation Commission's recommendation into a more comprehensive guideline.
- Pathways and green space letter as written by John Feldt was submitted. Planning and Zoning agrees in principal and would like to have the Recreation Commission involved with future efforts.

New Business:

- Fayetteville City Park
 - Adjacent to the activities house and will share the parking lot. The park will be a passive park consisting primarily of walking trails
- Kenwood Park Update
 - Public works is doing the grading
 - Phase II and III are up for bid.
- County Parks Field Reservations
 - Several recreation associations are concerned about use of the county fields and how they are rented out
 - Maintenance cost versus reservation or rental fees
 - How long and how often can a field be reserved by an individual or group
 - Anita to review the current policy and draft a recommendation for the Recreation Commission to review

- Jimmy Schwab is the new Softball Association President
- Jerry Stanford steps down as the Football Association President

Miscellaneous

- Fayette County Recreation Annual Retreat
 - Fayette County Recreation Associations will be invited to present 2006 needs at the February Recreation Commission meeting
