The meeting was opened at 7:23 pm by Chairperson LaFoy.

Anita Godbee advised that due to the lack of a quorum, no official votes could be taken.

Three guests were introduced to the members present.

Takiyah Claytor, who is a prospective member of the FCPAC, due to be installed at the B.O.C. meeting taking place on 8/8/2019.

Rachel Harvey and Cuyler Hovey-King who are Fayette County residents.

Old Business

Discussion began with the need for a new FCPAC banner to be displayed at future committee functions as the banner that we once had has been misplaced. Jacqueline Howell was asked to provide designs for the banner and will have them for the committee at a future meeting.

The Committee was advised by Anita Godbee that it is necessary to get at least 3 (three) price quotes for the printing of the banner.

Discussion continued with the mention of the 6th annual scarecrow competition. Anita Godbee supplied all in attendance with a set of guidelines and an entry form that will be used. Jacqueline Howell asked if there were any events that would coincide with the scarecrow competition. Anita Godbee said that the City of Fayetteville's Fall Festival and Children's Pumpkin Contest would be at the same time and that the winners of the Scarecrow contest would have a plaque displayed by their entries and that all scarecrows entered in the contest would stay on display until the weekend after Halloween.

Jacqueline Howell asked if the committee had anything on their calendar relating to Christmas. Cameron LaFoy pointed out that Parks and Rec has a Candy Cane hunt scheduled for 12/07/2019 at Kiwanis Park and it was suggested that the FCPAC have a "Crafters House" set up to coincide with that event. This would probably be a mostly "kids centric" affair with Christmas crafts available for anyone who wishes to come and participate and take something artistic home for the holiday.

New Business

The next discussion was of a possible change in the by-laws of the FCPAC to restructure the meeting schedule. The committee currently meets twice a month on the 1st Wednesday and again on the 3rd Monday. Cameron LaFoy proposed that the committee was meeting what basically amounts to every week and a half. He is proposing that the meetings be cut to once a month, potentially on the 2nd Wednesday of each month with the knowledge that, as is standard practice, if any additional meetings are needed they can be called at any member's discretion by notifying the chairperson who will then see that the meeting is called for and scheduled in a timely manner.

There was also further discussion of by-laws changes for a possible extension of terms. The FCPAC is the only committee that has terms of two years. Due to those terms being staggered, the frequency of appointing new members and having in-committee appointments for officers seems to be excessive. The point was brought up that it may be more efficient to have terms last either 3 or 4 years instead.

All of these potential changes will, of course, be discussed in greater detail once the committee has new members in place and there is a larger presence of voting members on hand at the next meeting.

Other Business

A question was raised by Takiyah Claytor about the social media presence of the committee. Anita Godbee gave information that the committee has no official social media presence due to county regulations. Cameron LaFoy informed the committee that while this was true, individuals, including those who are committee members, can invite or talk about committee events and post pictures of same on their personal social media platforms as long as they are not doing it in an official capacity.

It was explained to the guests in attendance that this was due to members of the committee being representatives of the county and as such, on social media or any other outlet, speak in an official capacity without the express consent of the county.

With no further discussions from members or guests, the meeting was closed at Approximately 8:00 pm by Chair Cameron LaFoy.

There was no motion to adjourn due to the absence of a quorum.
