#### **Age-Specific Programs**

(Registration is not required for our age-level programs unless noted.)

Baby Time: Wednesdays at 10 a.m.
Baby-friendly play time followed by songs, rhymes, puppets, stories and interactive fun for children ages 0-2.

Time for Twos: Tuesdays at 9:30 and 11 a.m. Songs, rhymes, puppets, stories and interactive fun for children ages 2-3 followed by a time for play and socialization with art, games and other toddler-friendly play.

#### Treasure Time: Wednesdays 11 a.m

Children ages **3-6 years** explore the treasures we find in books mixed with songs, poetry, puppets, science and social learning. Our program is followed by a time for play and socialization with art, games, literacy and learning kits, STEM explorations, and more.

#### \*Curiosity Club: Thursdays at 4 p.m.

Children ages **6-10 years** will explore longer fiction and nonfiction picture books followed by discussion and hands-on activities.

From February 21 – March 28 the Curiosity Club will partner with the Master Gardening program at the UGA Cooperative Extension Office for an exciting program called MG Sprouts. The six-session experience will introduce youth to the wonder of gardening through a series of activities and books. MG Sprouts is led by a Master Garderner Extension Volunteers who are screened and trained to extend gardening and horticulture information to the public. **THE EXTENSION SERVICE REQUIRES REGISTRATION. Guidelines for Age-Specific Programs
The goal for our age-specific programs is to provide a developmentally-appropriate space for children. We understand that this can be challenging with children of multiple ages in the family so we have intentionally created multi-age programs and as flexible as possible guidelines to help meet your family's needs and our program goals.

- Younger and older siblings can attend most of our programs as long as they are not disruptive. At least one child you bring should be in the age-group for program.
- Most of our programs require an adult to attend with the child. Programs with an asterisk \* are geared for children to attend independently. Younger siblings cannot attend these programs. Parents should remain in the library during the program.

### Sing, Play and Dance Mondays at 10 a.m. for ages 0-5

This is a lively program that builds early literacy skills through music, rhymes and interactive fun. Program is followed by a time of play with activities for all ages 0-5.

# Friday STEAM – One Friday each month at 10 a.m. and 3:30 p.m. All ages welcome but geared to ages 3-7 years.

This program will feature a time of booksharing with the librarian to explore a topic or idea related to science, technology, engineering, arts or math. After the time of sharing, there will be an hour for caregiver/child exploration of stations related to the topic.

#### Family Book Club: Fourth Thursday: 7-8 p.m.

Check out this month's family read and come to our book club to enjoy art, games or other activities related to the book. This is geared to families with at least one child who is age 4-11 years.

Pajama Story Time: First Thursday: 7 – 7:30 p.m. Wear your favorite PJ's and come enjoy stories and more with your librarian. All ages welcome.

## Story Builders: Mondays 3:30 p.m. and one Saturday per month at 10 a.m. All ages welcome but geared to ages 4-11years
